## 3. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

Mr Peter Ducker, Mrs Claire Ducker and Mr Anthony Ryan attended the Council and asked questions in relation to the Item 9.4.1, "Local Planning Scheme No 5 Amendment No 1".

## Peter Ducker: Question 1

## In reference to the response give to Submitter No 2 in the Schedule of Submissions: If this land is rezoned but not built on or used, does the landowner need to install a buffer?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated yes. The landowner would need to submit an application for "use", which would then be conditioned to require a green buffer to mitigate noise and dust depending on the "use" approved.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 2

In reference to the response give to Submitter No 2 in the Schedule of Submissions: The response states the "additional 'Cottage Industry Use' use and approval currently in place on Lot 1 Danubin Street is not based on how often it is utilised over a period of time, but on the basis that this 'use; can occur on that lot every day should the land owner choose to." This is incorrect as I can only operate 6 days a week, I cannot utilise this on Sundays.

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that yes, the referred to Planning Approval is for up to 6 days of use. This response is given as a number of submissions infer that the use is a hobby, including your own submission, however, the Planning Approval is for full commercial activity under this use 6 days a week.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 3

In the time that it takes to establish a green buffer, what can and/or will the Shire do to enforce mitigation of dust and noise?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that he was unable to answer that question immediately, as further investigation would need to be done into what interim measures would be available, however it is up to the landowner to comply with the condition of the Planning Approval.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 4

Would one of the interim measures referred to above be a bigger restriction area, and if so, wouldn't the useable area on Lot 200 then become a smaller area than what is currently available on Lot 178?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that this may be possibly be the case, however this is a commercial decision of the landowner and the Shire is not responsible for that commercial decision.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 5

#### Can't the landowner install culverts and access Lot 178 over the creek?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that the engineering expectation is that a culvert would wash out during a thunderstorm, as this watercourse becomes inundated with a huge volume of water off the road drainage, however that is the consideration of the landowner.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 6

In reference to the response give to Submitter No 10 in the Schedule of Submissions: The response states that "Lot 200 originally formed part of Lot 178". This is incorrect, it was originally all Lot 351. I also believe that the response is incorrect as Lot 178 was rezoned Rural Residential as part of Local Planning Scheme No. 4.

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that in response to the first point, Lot 200 is a typographical error and should read Lot 351, however the intent is the same.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 7

The responses refer to me not providing evidence of the devaluation of my property, just because there is no evidence provided does not mean there is not a loss of value.

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that therefore the Shire's response is correct – there is no evidence for the Shire to either support or not support this claim. The Shire engages with Valuers every year as part of the Fair Value process, and the indication of these Valuers to the Shire has historically been that any economic activity within the Shire increases values, however with no evidence provided for or against the case, it is fairer for the Shire to respond that it has no comment. If you do have the evidence to support your claim then would it not help your submission to provide that information?

## Peter Ducker: Question 8

## McIntosh & Sons have previously run a Seed Destructor on the fence line of Lot 200. Is it the opinion of the Shire that this is a Light Industry use?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that Light Industry is not the same as General Industry. If noise from a particular piece of machinery is long term or constant, from a noise point of view, use such as this may have to be restricted, however the predominant "use" of the land is well suited to Light Industry.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 9

#### What can I do? (In reference to question 8)

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated the Shire is aware of two noise complaints that have been made by yourself. In each instance you have been advised of the course of action taken, and provided with advise on how to proceed, including keeping of a diary, the Shire's Environmental Health Officer has dealt with the two complaints that you have raised.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 10

Why did the petition of 105 signatures not carry weight as a formal public submission? The people who signed this voted for you all as Councillors.

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated the petition was appended to Mr Ducker's own submission, however each signature did not constitute a public submission on its own right.

The Shire President stated that he had read all submissions in full. He stated that it was his view that the petition foreword was falsely worded, by stating that the proposed rezoning of Lot 178 would be 'Industrial'. The Shire President stated that he had spoken directly with five of the petition signatories, who each had advised that they were unaware that the proposed rezoning was for Light Industry, not General Industry.

Claire Ducker responded that the term 'Industrial' had been used, as they were unsure themselves of what the proposal was at the time of the petition.

The Shire President stated that yes, the petition did carry weight in terms of the intent.

Peter Ducker stated that the term 'Industrial' in the Scheme Text did give two classes, Light and General.

The Chief Executive Officer stated that he was of the view that Council did deem the petition important, which is why the Shire took the action to write to all petitioners and provide them with all the relevant documentation and opportunity to make a public submission in the format required.

The Chief Executive Officer stated that he was of the view that twelve public submissions were received as a direct result of the Shire taking this action.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 11

#### Who will enforce buffers if they are conditioned as part of a Development Application?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated the enforcing of buffers would be the Shire's responsibility.

#### **Claire Ducker: Question 1**

#### Why is the Shire not enforcing buffers now on Lot 200?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated there is no current requirement for buffers of Lot 200, therefore there is no condition to enforce. Should Lot 200 be rezoned to Light Industry, Council will condition to include buffers.

#### Peter Ducker: Question 12

#### What happens if the WAPC does not accept the decision of Council?

Answer: The Chief Executive Officer stated that it was his understanding that the land owner could choose to appeal the decision and that would be the land owners individual choice and decision and not the domain of the Shire.

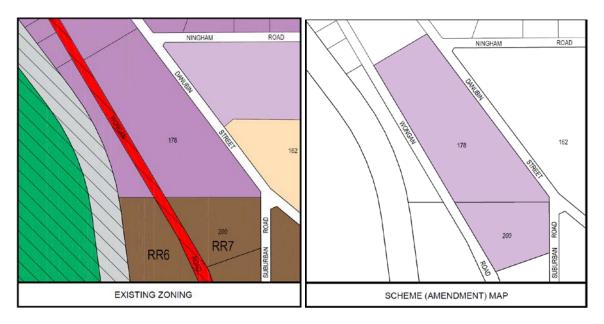
## PURPOSE OF REPORT:

To consider adoption of Scheme Amendment No 1 to the Shire of Wongan Ballidu Local Planning Scheme No 5; to allow for the rezoning of:

- Lot 200 Wongan Road, Wongan Hills from 'Rural Residential' to 'Light Industry', and
- Lot 178 Wongan Road Wongan Hills from 'General Industry' to 'Light Industry'

## BACKGROUND:

The Council resolved at the November 2017 Council Meeting to advertise Amendment No. 1, which proposes to rezone Lots178 and 200 to Light Industrial.



Prior to advertising, the amendment was referred to the Environmental Protection Authority, where it was determined that the Scheme Amendment is unlikely to have a significant effect on the environment and does not warrant formal assessment under Part IV of the Environmental Protection Act.

Following notice from the EPA, the Amendment was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.* At the close of advertising, 16 submissions were received.

## COMMENT:

Council is requested to consider submissions received, subsequent additional information provided, and then determine whether to support the local planning scheme amendment.

A 'Schedule of Submissions' has been developed to identify issues raised during the advertising process.

A total of 18 submissions were received.

The Schedule of Submissions is available as an attachment to this report item.

The key issues raised include:

- 1. Noise, dust, vibration and amenity
- 2. Devaluation of properties;
- 3. In keeping with local planning strategy
- 4. Increase in traffic Volumes
- 5. Use of existing land on Lot 178
- 6. Access to Lot 200

Council previously initiated and advertised Local Planning Scheme Amendment No.1, which proposes to change the zoning of Lots 178 and 200 to Light Industrial. As a result of the referral process to state agencies, additional information has been provided to address the following matters:

#### Noise, dust, vibration and amenity

The new Local Planning Scheme No 5 included the addition of the zoning category of Light Industry to enable improved planning controls on land adjacent to Rural Residential and Residential Zoned land that has an industrial type use.

The current Scheme provides the mechanisms to enable conditions and buffer zones to mitigate noise dust and any potential vibration from agricultural machinery produced on Lot 200. These will be applied to any Development Application received for the use of Lot 200 and any future development plans for Lot 178.

The additional "Cottage Industry Use" approval in place on the adjacent Rural Residential Lot 1 Danubin Road referred to in three of the submissions is for Panel Beating, Spray Painting and works associated with vehicle restorations on a paid commercial basis. The Cottage Industry use and approval is not based on how often it is utilised over a period of time, but on the basis that this 'use' can occur on that lot every day should the land owner choose to.

#### Devaluation of properties

In one submission, it is indicated that a Property Valuer was engaged to determine if the property at Lot 1 Danubin Road would lose value if the Scheme Amendment for Lot 200 was to proceed. The submission indicates that the property would lose value.

An email request was sent to the submitter, Mr Peter Ducker, on 30 April 2018 requesting a copy of the Valuation to enable this to be considered as part of the assessment process. At the time of writing this report, the Shire had not received a response.

In relation to the discussion and consideration as to whether the property in question would lose or gain value as a result of the scheme amendment approval, the Shire is unable to comment, as there is no evidence to either support or not support this claim.

Submissions have been submitted by others voicing the same concern, in particular those that are land owners situated in Gum Tree Valley and Gratton Heights Rural Residential subdivisions. The Shire of Wongan Ballidu Local Planning Strategy <u>does not</u> support any development other than Rural Residential in these areas. Part of the review of Local Planning Scheme 5 was to rezone blocks of Industry zoned land to the south east of Gratton Heights to Rural Residential land in line with the Local Planning Strategy.

## In keeping with Local Planning Strategy

The Shire of Wongan-Ballidu Local Planning Strategy supports the expansion of General and Light Industry for the future sustainability of the town and the Shire.

The Local Planning Strategy identifies Wongan Road as the primary area for expansion as this has major road frontage and is consistent with the already existing Industry and Light Industry uses.

The proposal is consistent with the strategic direction set in the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu Local Planning Strategy, which encourages light industry activities on Wongan Road.

### Increase in traffic volumes on Danubin Road

Danubin Road is a reasonable volume road given it gives access to a portion of Gratton Heights Rural Residential subdivision, as well as already existing farming enterprises and ancillary business premises.

#### Use of existing land on Lot 178

The Shire is advised that due to a watercourse running through Lot 178, there is inadequate land available to enable the setup and testing of machinery; the watercourse also provides an access issue to this portion of Lot 178 for large and small machinery.

Any future expansion of built infrastructure would be better suited on that portion of Lot 178.

## Access to Lot 200

Access to Lot 200 in all likelihood will be gained from Lot 178; it is unlikely that there would be a significant increase in traffic. The submission received from Main Roads WA covers access to Wongan Road from Lot 200, however it is likely that access to Lot 200 would be from the adjacent Lot 178 (as this is what occurs now), rather than significant access from Suburban Road.

The Shire's Local Planning Strategy (LPS) recommends provision of land to meet the demand for service industry adjacent to the town centre and the Ningham Road area. A transition from general industry to service/light industry is recommended.

## **Petition Received**

Mr Peter and Mrs Claire Ducker attended the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 18 April 2018 to present a petition regarding the proposed Scheme Amendment. The petition contained 105 signatures of local residents.

On 19 April 2018, the Shire wrote to 102 of these signatories, advising that the petition did not constitute a formal submission, and providing the opportunity and documentation to submit a formal public submission. Three signatories were not written to - one of these signatories was known to be since deceased, and Peter and Claire Ducker as signatories had already expressed intention to submit a formal public submission.

As a result of this correspondence from the Shire, fifteen public submissions were received. Five envelopes were returned 'Not at this Address/Return to Sender'.

## POLICY REQUIREMENTS:

There are no policy requirements in relation to this item.

#### LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS:

Scheme Amendments undergo a statutory process in accordance with the *Planning and Development Act 2005* and *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.* 

Section 75 of the *Planning and Development Act 2005* allows a local government authority to amend its Local Planning Scheme with the approval of the Minister for Planning.

Section 81 of the Act requires a local government to refer an adopted Local Planning Scheme Amendment to the Environmental Protection Authority to determine if it should be assessed.

Regulation 50(3) of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* allows Council to adopt a Standard Scheme Amendment for advertising and referral to relevant public authorities.

#### STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS:

Council is required to exercise its quasi-judicial function in this matter.

When exercising its discretion in relation to planning matters, the pertinent strategic Documents are the Shire of Wongan Ballidu Local Planning Strategy and Strategic Community Plan.

This proposal is consistent with the strategic direction set in those plans.

The Shire's Local Planning Strategy (LPS) recommends provision of land to meet the demand for service industry adjacent to the town centre and Ningham Road area. A transition from general industry to service/light industry is recommended

Local Government Act Subdivision 2 – Committees and their meetings. Council may establish committees of 3 or more persons being either, Council members only, Council members and employees, Council members, employees and other persons, Council members and other persons, Employees and other persons, or Other persons only

At any given time, each council member is entitled to be a member of at least one committee referred to in section 5.9(2)(a) or (b) and if a council member nominates himself or herself to be a member of such a committee or committees, the local government is to include that council member in the persons appointed under subsection (1)(a) to at least one of those committees as the local government decides.

At a meeting of the council a local government is to make an appointment to a committee that has or could have a council member as a member and the mayor or president informs the local government of his or her wish to be a member of the committee, the local government is to appoint the mayor or president to be a member of the committee.

At a meeting of the council a local government is to make an appointment to a committee that has or will have an employee as a member and the CEO informs the local government of his or her wish —

(a) to be a member of the committee; or

(b) that a representative of the CEO be a member of the committee,

the local government is to appoint the CEO or the CEO's representative, as the case may be, to be a member of the committee.

The local government may appoint\* a person to be a deputy of a member of a committee and may terminate such an appointment\* at any time.

person who is appointed as a deputy of a member of a committee is to be ---

(a) if the member of the committee is a council member — a council member; or

(b) if the member of the committee is an employee — an employee; or

(c) if the member of the committee is not a council member or an employee — a person who is not a council member or an employee; or

(d) if the member of the committee is a person appointed under section 5.10(5) — a person nominated by the CEO.

A deputy of a member of a committee may perform the functions of the member when the member is unable to do so by reason of illness, absence or other cause.

A deputy of a member of a committee, while acting as a member, has all the functions of and all the protection given to a member.
