### **PURPOSE OF REPORT:**

The purpose of this report is to request that Council reallocate two projects within the framework of the current adopted budget to accommodate for savings derived from various bitumen application projects.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Council currently receives an allocation of \$382,520 per annum as part of the Federal Government's "Roads to Recovery" funding programme (R2R).

This funding is provided specifically for road infrastructure improvement and preservation projects.

During the 2011/2012 budget process six (6) R2R projects were approved, being:

- B0006 Manmanning Road final seal (\$11,340.00)
- B0007 Moonijin West Road final seal (\$4,136.00)
- B0139 Oliver Road final seal (\$46,778.00)
- B0195 Hospital Road final seal (\$250,520.00)
- BA195 Hospital Road final seal (\$14,900.00)
- B0197 Wongan-Cadoux Road final seal (\$54,846.00)

The total allocation for these R2R projects was \$382,520.00

As all six projects involved the application of final seals, the amounts submitted during the budget process was based on estimates, as the formal 2011/2012 bitumen tender had yet to be finalised.

At its August 2011 Ordinary meeting, Council accepted a tender form R<sup>N</sup>R which reflected significant savings between the budgeted and the actual amount for the supply and spreading of bitumen.

All six (6) projects have now been completed, realising an under expenditure of \$71,562 ex GST.

However, in order to acquit the full R2R funding for 2011/2012, Council needs to have fully expended the annual allocation (\$382,520).

### **COMMENT:**

The above reallocations are for legislative purposes only and have no adverse impact on the overall Capital Works expenditure.

Council is requested to reallocation two (2) existing uncompleted projects from COA "EROAD" (Capital Road Construction - Preservation works – Councils own funds) to COA "BROAD" (Capital Road Construction – Roads To Recovery Funding) to reflect saving made on the cost of bitumen.

Currently all approved BROAD projects have been completed, realising a saving of \$71,562 ex GST.

It is recommended that the following projects be reallocated from COA "EROAD" to COA "BROAD" to allow the acquittal of the 2011/2012 R2R funding allocation:

- Job No. E0022 (Kirwan Road gravel resheet (\$28,801.00) be reallocated to B0022
- Job No. E0035 (Old Wongan-Koorda gravel resheet (\$45,002.00) be reallocated to B0035

### **PURPOSE OF REPORT:**

The purpose of this report is to present sufficient information to Council to enable a detailed review of existing policies to be carried out.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The purpose of policy documents is to enable the effective and efficient management of Council resources and to assist staff and Council achieve an equitable decision making process. Written policies also enable the community to be aware of the reasoning behind administrative and Council decisions and to thus be familiar with the philosophy behind individual decisions. Policy statements enable much of the day-to-day business of Council to be handled by the Administration, freeing up the time of the Elected Members to better focus their resources on major policy items and formulation of strategic direction.

An up-to-date policy manual of any organisation proves to be a valuable tool in improving the decision making process. Policies contained within the manual are those that project a corporate image and are not controlled by individual directorates. The development of the policies involves input from staff across the organisation and elected members.

A policy statement is not binding on Council but provides a guideline for Elected Members and staff in determining individual applications or requests. Generally, policies evolve as issues come before Council and should continue to evolve though a process of review and refinement. For this reason, it is important that a review process is in place. It is also possible for members of the community to seek an early review of a specific policy.

Each policy is developed in order to address specific matters. They relate to objectives to the Shire of Wongan-Ballidu, and, in some instances, as required by legislation. The principles behind the policies are directly related to the Shire's values as an organisation.

It is important to note that the manual should only contain the policy statement of the Council and should not refer to operational, staff or procedural matters.

In accordance with Council's Policy Review Process, the entire policy manual is to be reviewed at least every two years.

### **COMMENT:**

Council has a total of thirty three (33) policies relating to the Works & Services directorate. Most of these are due for review in accordance with the "Policy Review Process".

The Chief Executive Officer is responsible for the coordination of this review and has instructed staff to implement a sequenced review of all policies.

With those policies pertaining to Works & Services, a rigorous review of all thirty three (33) policies will be conducted over a six (6) month period, which would involve at addressing at least five (5) or six (6) policies per month.

The policies selected for the May 2012 review are:

- · Fines and Infringements
- · Service Provider Road Reinstatements
- Water Crossing on Gazetted Roads
- · Soil Conservation Drainage
- · Standpipe Water Charges
- · Road Intersections

Not all of the above policies meet the requirements as set out by Council, as outline below:

### Fines and Infringements

In the opinion of the author, this policy continues to meet the objectives of Council

### Service Provider Road Reinstatements

In the opinion of the author, this policy continues to meet the objectives of Council

### Water Crossings on Gazetted Roads

In the opinion of the author, this policy continues to meet the objectives of Council

In the opinion of the author, this policy continues to meet the objectives of Council

### Standpipe Water Charges

In the opinion of the author, this policy continues to meet the objectives of Council

### · Road Intersections

In the opinion of the author, this policy is deemed unnecessary as all design works, by default, should reflect current best practice. It is recommended that this policy should be revoked

### **POLICY REQUIREMENTS:**

The Policy Manual has been developed over time to enable the effective and efficient management of Council resources and to assist staff and Council achieve an equitable decision making process.

The Policy Manual should not relate to operational or staff related matters.

The Policy Manual is a fluid document and should be reviewed in it's entirety at least every 2 years.

### LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS:

The Local Government Act 1995 outlines the roles of Council and the CEO.

### STRATEGIC IMPLICATIONS:

- 2. The upstream landholder agrees to meet all costs associated with the provision of the materials for and the construction of such floodways or culverts, as the Council shall deem necessary;
- 3. Construction of the culverts or floodways is carried out to an approved design, at Councils convenience, and if the landowner, under Council supervision.
